Our brief time back in the US has been going well. We should have all the necessary paperwork in-hand to go back with us to Honduras and we should be able to apply for our 5-year special residency permit in March. From there we have to wait on the Honduran government to process it all and then we will know when the residency process is complete. This special residency permit will allow us to legally work within the country long term and start a lot of what we will need in order to plant churches for the future.

During our time in Florida we have been able to visit Orlando Baptist Church in Orlando, our supporting church; this church also hosted the BBFI National meeting. From there we presented our ministry for support to First Coast Baptist Church in Jacksonville. Next, we had a chance to re-visit another supporting church, Grace Bible Baptist Church in Leesburg. From there we started a missions conference with Lighthouse Baptist Church in Port Charlotte and got to present our family and work in Honduras for their potential support. Immediately following that conference, we went to be a part of another missions conference with Park Street Baptist Church in St. Petersburg and are excited to be one of the newest members of their missions family! We will wrap up with Key Largo Baptist Church, participating in their missions month, and then lastly on to Palm Springs Drive Baptist Church in Altamonte Springs for their missions conference.
